Top Tips for Homework

- Check every evening to see if your child has been set home learning tasks.
- Help your child with organisation and managing time. Students should be working on the project over the set time and not rushing the project the night before the deadline.
- Buy a folder just for home learning work.
- Help your child plan ideas before starting the work.
- Encourage them to use a dictionary and thesaurus.
- Ensure that your child does not copy and paste huge amounts of information from the Internet. Also avoid Wikipedia if possible.
- Encourage your child to use the LRC (Learning Resource Centre) within school. The LRC contains a huge selection of books which can be used for research and computers. The LRC is open at break and lunchtimes.



Students need to read regularly in order to succeed in all aspects of school life. Increasingly GCSE exam papers are becoming more difficult and students need a reading age of at least 13 years to understand and comprehend the paper. We believe that students who read regularly will achieve in all subject areas.

A reading book is a vital part of school equipment and students need to bring a reading book every day. Students will need to read during some of their tutor periods and for 10 mins at the start of certain lessons each week.

Research has proven that students who read regularly make progress in all subject areas. Reading helps improve general comprehension and vocabulary skills.

Top Tips for Reading

- Encourage your child to read for at least fifteen minutes per evening.
- Listen to you child read aloud.
- Ask your child questions about what they are reading.
- Explain the meanings of words which they do not understand.
