It doesn't matter what sporting qualification you choose to study Post 16, the content across awarding bodies will be the same; it is the assessment of the content that differs.

A Level 3 BTEC in Sport will be modular, in that you will study the content and then complete an assignment (much like you did during your time at Westbourne). However, the major difference being that you will be expected to work a lot more independently and stick to deadlines!!! There are also two exams; one at the end of each year.

A-Level PE is a lot different in that all the content will be delivered across the two years and then you will sit your exams at the end. You will also be assessed in your sporting ability in a sport.

The content that is shared across all qualifications is:

- Anatomy and Physiology
- Skill Aquisition
- Coaching and Development
- Sports Nutrition
- Sports Psychology

Spanish

It is important that you continue accessing the Spanish language as much as is possible before starting and post GCSE courses. The best thing for this would be revising anything that was covered as part of the GCSE course using the recommended sites such as Quizlet, Active Learn and Seneca. The better you know the GCSE course, the better you will progress at A-Level.

In addition to this, you may wish to expand your cultural knowledge of Spain and the Spanish speaking world. There are a range of films online that will help you better understand the language and culture. A good starting point would be Pan's Labyrinth or films by the director Pedro Almodovar.

Read any books about Spain that you can find, even if they are in English. Books like Dave Boling's Guernica and Victoria Hislop's The Return give you an insight into Spain at the time of the Civil War. Ian Gibson's Fire in the Blood: The New Spain has an enormous amount of information on Spain over the last century up to modern times. The more you know, the easier it will be to come up with ideas in an oral, and understand reading and listening texts in an exam.

Also read literature in Spanish – especially South American writers like García Marquéz and Vargas Llosa. Try works by Antonio Gala, Arturo Perez Reverte and Alberto Vazquez Figueroa who are contemporary writers from Spain.
