#### How will I be assessed?

- Teachers will **assess students against national standards**, which were defined by the exam boards at Easter.
- Subject teams will submit grades which will be quality assured by the subject team, Mr Hawkes
  and Mr Bouckley. This internal quality assurance process will have to be signed off by the exam
  board to ensure it is rigorous and in line with national standards.
- Our results will be **quality assured externally** by the exam boards, which may include random sampling of our evidence.
- If the exam boards are confident in our submitted results, then they will award students their final grades.
- If students do not think their results are accurate, they will have the right to appeal.

#### How will my grades be determined?

This document shows an overview of your assessments for every subject. As you will see, there is a mixture of short tests, PRE's and some class work. The assessments are from the exam boards and follow set mark schemes to ensure that your grades are standardised across all schools. Topics we haven't taught, and you haven't had chance to learn, won't be included. We will also look back at previous data as well, and use it as a guide to the grade distribution. Furthermore, we will ensure that where possible, a range of topics and assessment objectives are covered to make sure that the grade you receive is reflective of the expectations of the course.

# Will teachers judge me on everything I have been taught?

The professional judgement of teachers will only be based on what candidates have been taught and teachers will use a range of evidence from across the course of study to make their decision.





### Does the evidence include any incomplete work?

This evidence may include pieces of work that have already been completed/partially completed and/or further tests/assessments that will be set.

# Is the evidence the same for everybody?

The range of evidence that teachers use to inform grades will be consistent across each class or cohort for each qualification. However, we may decide that a different range of evidence may be more appropriate to fairly inform a grade, if, for example, a candidate has missed significantly more teaching than others in the class.

#### I am entitled to access arrangements, have these been accounted for?

If you have been granted approved access arrangements/reasonable adjustments, we will ensure that these were/are in place when evidence was/is being gathered. Where appropriate reasonable adjustments were not in place when you took an assessment that is being used as evidence, the teacher should take that into account when determining your grade or we could also consider whether other evidence could be used instead.

#### Which assessments will be considered as evidence in each subject?

This document provides for you a summary of the assessment evidence that your teachers will consider to calculate your final grade.

#### When will I receive my results?

Results day will be Thursday 12th August.

# How do I appeal if I do not agree with the grade I have been awarded?
