CEOP

Everyone who comes into contact with children and their families has a role to play in safeguarding the welfare of children. At Westbourne Academy, safeguarding is considered everyone's responsibility. It forms part of the wider safeguarding system for children and we have a duty of care to keep children safe and to enable the best outcomes for all.

The safeguarding of our students has three main elements:

- **1.** Prevention through the creation of a positive academy atmosphere and the teaching and pastoral support offered to students.
- **2.** Protection by following agreed procedures, ensuring staff are trained and supported to respond appropriately and sensitively to safeguarding concerns.
- 3. Support to students who have been abused or witnessed abuse. Abuse can be defined as physical, emotional, sexual or neglect.

Our academy will:

- 1. Establish and maintain an environment where students feel safe and secure, are encouraged to talk, and are listened to.
- 2. Ensure that students know that there are adults within the academy who they can approach if they are worried or are in difficulty.
- **3.** Include activities and opportunities in the curriculum, which equip students with the skills they need to stay safe from all forms of abuse and to stay safe online.
- **4.** Ensure that, wherever possible, every effort will be made to work closely with parents, the local community and outside agencies.

Visitors to our academy are expected to:

- 1. Sign in and out at reception.
- 2. Wear a visitors badge, that is visible, at all times.
- 3. Behave and conduct themselves in a manner that is appropriate for an institution that works with young people.
- ► Safeguarding is everyone's responsibility
- The needs of the child are paramount
- The need for help is identified early
- > Anyone with a concern for a child should make a referral

At Westbourne Academy, we work with social care, the police, health services and other agencies to promote the welfare of children and protect them from harm. Children includes everyone under the age of 18.

In compliance with the Key Safeguarding Employment Standards, all members of staff, governors and volunteers will:

- be appropriately qualified
- have the relevant employment history
- have the necessary checks carried out
- have enhanced Disclosure and Barring Service checks (DBS)
- have access to safeguarding training every year, as well as regular updates

All child protection concerns will be acted on immediately. The following indicators are listed under the categories of abuse:

- Physical Abuse Emotional Abuse
- Sexual Abuse Neglect
