

Safeguarding

Everyone who comes into contact with children and their families has a role to play in safeguarding the welfare of children. At Westbourne Academy, safeguarding is considered everyone's responsibility. It forms part of the wider safeguarding system for children and we have a duty of care to keep children safe and to enable the best outcomes for all.

The safeguarding of our students has three main elements:

- Prevention through the creation of a positive academy atmosphere and the teaching and pastoral support offered to students.
- 2. Protection by following agreed procedures, ensuring staff are trained and supported to respond appropriately and sensitively to safeguarding concerns.
- Support to students who have been abused or witnessed abuse. Abuse can be defined as physical, emotional, sexual or neglect.

Our academy will:

- Establish and maintain an environment where students feel safe and secure, are encouraged to talk, and are listened to.
- Ensure that students know that there are adults within the academy who they can approach if they are worried or are in difficulty.
- Include activities and opportunities in the curriculum, which equip students with the skills they need to stay safe from all forms of abuse and to stay safe online.
- 4. Ensure that, wherever possible, every effort will be made to work closely with parents, the local community and outside agencies.

Visitors to our academy are expected to:

- 1. Sign in and out at reception.
- 2. Wear a visitors badge, that is visible, at all times.
- Behave and conduct themselves in a manner that is appropriate for an institution that works with young people.
