Did you know that in church we use different colours at different times? On the altar are different coverings and during the service, those leading worship, wear different colour robes. These all have meaning. White or gold is usually a celebration, red usually when we are thinking about the Holy Spirit or Martyrs, purple for more solemn times such as lent or advent or maybe when someone has died. Lastly there is green which is the colour used at all other times and especially at this time of year....... and green is for growth.

So green reminds us to pay attention to how we grow. That might be how we grow closer to God, or how we grow in our spiritual lives. Everyone has a spiritual life even if its not as part of a faith or belief system. It is an essential part of who we are and includes such things as a search for meaning and purpose, the awareness that there is something greater than the individual, it can encompass awe and wonder, pain and sorrow, a search for connectedness or for the sacred.

As we travel through summer it is a good time to pay heed to developing our spiritual lives, to find things that make us say 'wow' in nature, art, literature or music maybe, or in our worship at church. To allow ourselves time to be present to things around us; to stop and take in the wonderful sunset or the child laughing, the bird song or the butterfly. Only when our spiritual lives are nurtured can we find wholeness. We often give time and attention to our physical, emotional and mental wellbeing but how often do we nurture our spirit?

As Christians we have the great joy of lots of things that help us to nurture that spiritual side of our selves. We do this through prayer, through music, fellowship, through celebrating with people and celebrating the fruits of the earth and in seeking that relationship with the God who is Love, and finding meaning and purpose in our faith and all it gives to and requires of us.

Religious or not, try keeping a diary of one spiritual moment you encounter in each day? and if you don't have one then the next day actively try and find 2! I am sure this will become a source of blessing to you.

If you would like to grow among us at Whitton Church please just come along any Sunday, you will find a warm welcome, 09.30 most weeks except the first Sunday of the month when it's a very relaxed service at 10am!

So go green, go grow and may it be a blessing to you!

open during the daytime but there is always someone there to enable access on the first Saturday of the month between May and September from 12 until 3pm. Or you could join us for Cream Tea in the churchyard at 5.30pm on Sunday 3<sup>rd</sup> August followed by BCP Communion in the church, or at one of our Evensong Services throughout August at 6.30pm each Sunday. Harvest festival there will be on Sunday 21st September at 3.30pm and carols by Candlelight on Wednesday 17<sup>th</sup> December at 7.30pm.

This was an opportunity for children to come into church and learn about the Easter story in a fun and immersive way. Over four days we welcomed approximately 176 pupils into church from four different schools: The Beeches Community Primary School, St Pancras Catholic Primary School, Thomas Wolsey Ormiston Academy and Castle Hill Primary School. The children heard the Easter story and then moved around six stations which brought each part of the story to life. Each station had a theme and an activity with something for the children to experience and reflect on. The pupils really enjoyed the sessions and we had some lovely feedback from school staff about the pupils' engagement and what a calm atmosphere it was. We are so pleased it was such a great success and look forward to planning the next experience event for later in the year.



We could not have run this event without the support of many amazing volunteers. They not only ran the stations but many also supported with setting up, packing away and helping to resource the event.
